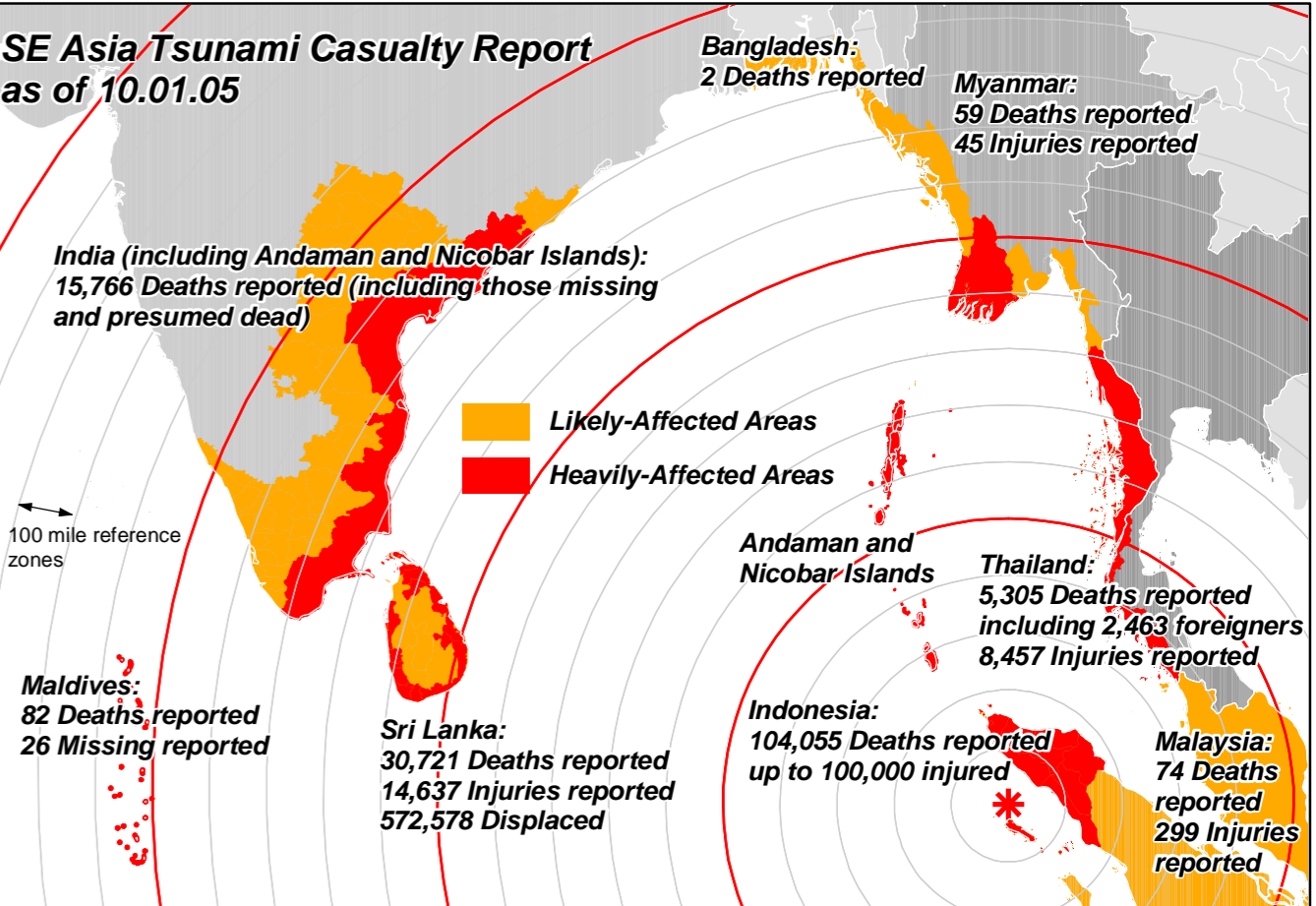
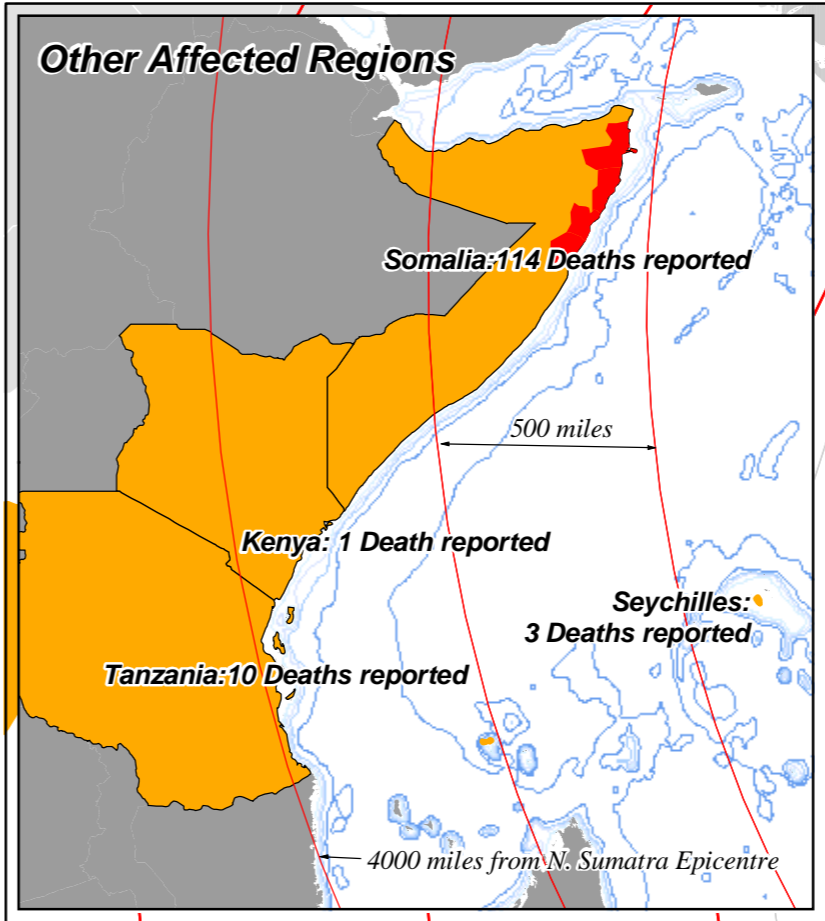
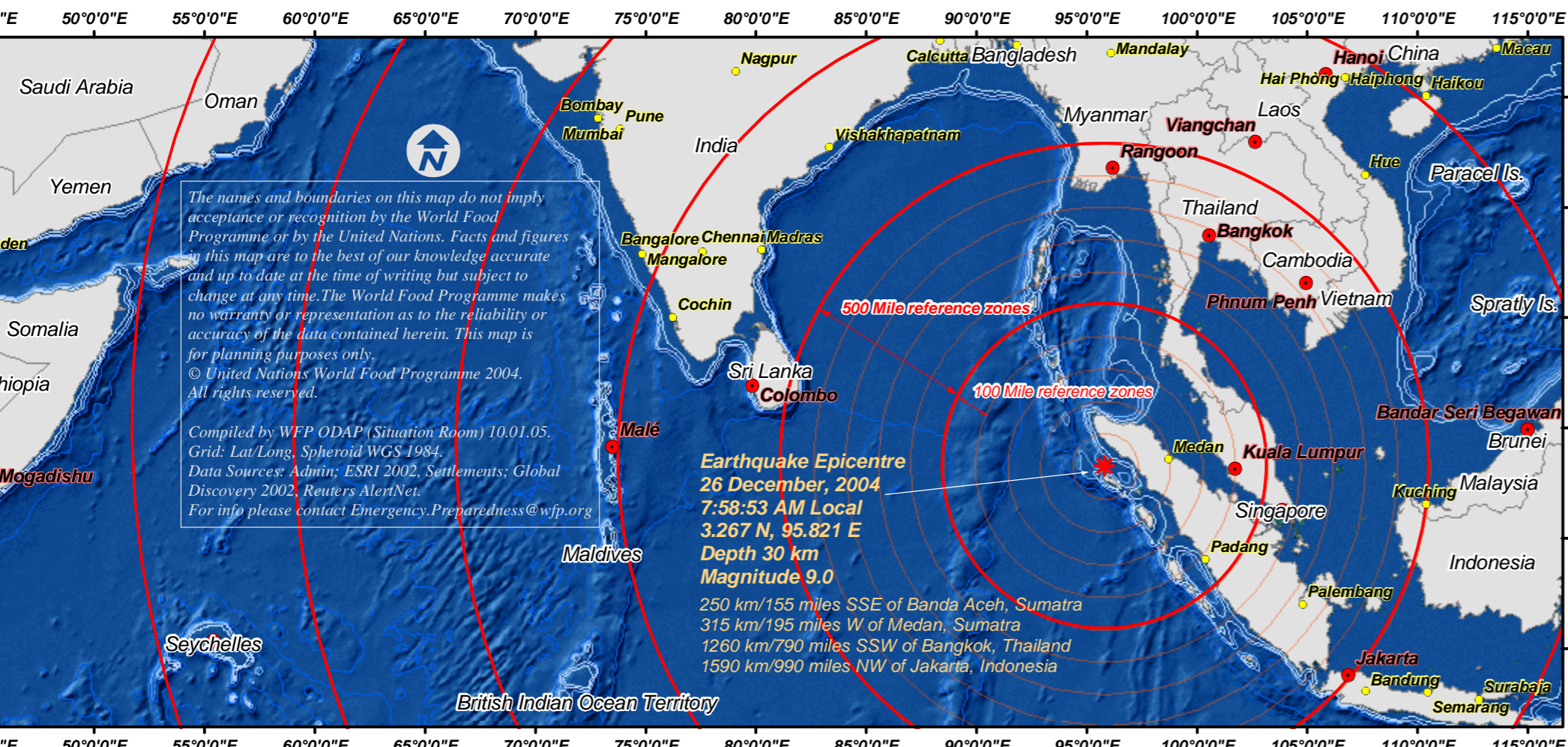
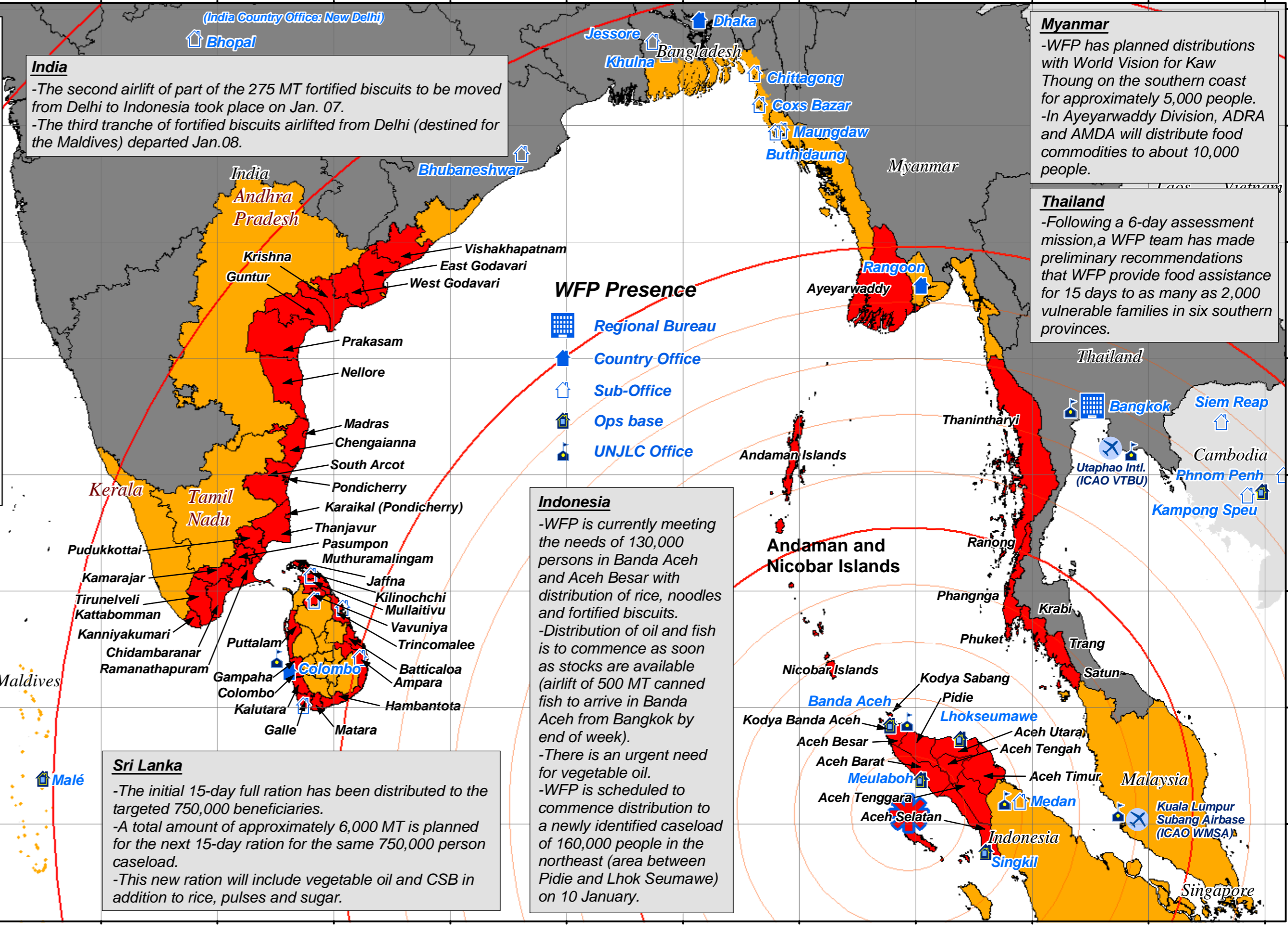
Maldives
 -50,000 potential beneficiaries of which approximately 12,500 are displaced.
 -WFP, other UN agencies and the Government are exploring options for school feeding and other programme interventions to assist the relief effort.
 -WFP and UNICEF are looking into using biscuits to feed up to 25,000 children for a period of eight weeks.

Sri Lanka
 -The initial 15-day full ration has been distributed to the targeted 750,000 beneficiaries.
 -A total amount of approximately 6,000 MT is planned for the next 15-day ration for the same 750,000 person caseload.
 -This new ration will include vegetable oil and CSB in addition to rice, pulses and sugar.

Indonesia
 -WFP is currently meeting the needs of 130,000 persons in Banda Aceh and Aceh Besar with distribution of rice, noodles and fortified biscuits.
 -Distribution of oil and fish is to commence as soon as stocks are available (airlift of 500 MT canned fish to arrive in Banda Aceh from Bangkok by end of week).
 -There is an urgent need for vegetable oil.
 -WFP is scheduled to commence distribution to a newly identified caseload of 160,000 people in the northeast (area between Pidie and Lhok Seumawe) on 10 January.

Myanmar
 -WFP has planned distributions with World Vision for Kaw Thoun on the southern coast for approximately 5,000 people.
 -In Ayeyarwaddy Division, ADRA and AMDA will distribute food commodities to about 10,000 people.

Thailand
 -Following a 6-day assessment mission, a WFP team has made preliminary recommendations that WFP provide food assistance for 15 days to as many as 2,000 vulnerable families in six southern provinces.
